He was the first canonised Catholic male saint of Indian origin and belonged to Syro - Malabar church based in the state of Kerala. St. Chavara is popularly known as a 'Pioneer of Education', a visionary, the most prudent who was well-versed in sacred scriptures. He was the heroic son of church in India who worked for the upliftment of down trodden society and equality among people with a goal 'Education for All'. St. Chavara with his prophetic vision triggered a society that looks up to him. His activities and pioneering services were unique. Being a saintly catholic priest, St Kuriakose Elias Chavara was a star symbol of integration. He is the founder of CMI and CMC congregations. The students, each day of the week prepared themselves and excelled in exhibiting the speeches about St Chavara and St Euphrasia. St. Euphrasia was an Indian Carmelite nun of the Syro-Malabar church in Kerala. St. Euphrasia is said to have had a vision of the holy Family at which point the illness she had long felt ceased. St. Euphrasia was canonised as a saint by the Pope Francis on 23rd November, 2014 in Vatican City. Many miracles are attributed to St Euphrasia and countless believers beg for intercession with great reverence believing in the sanctity of the life of St Euphrasia. 'The Carmel Buds' offered candles and flowers to St. Chavara and St Euphrasia for their intercessory prayers and thanked them for favours and blessings. St. Chavara's famous quotes were rehearsed and expressed by the students. 


Farewell Day 2022
