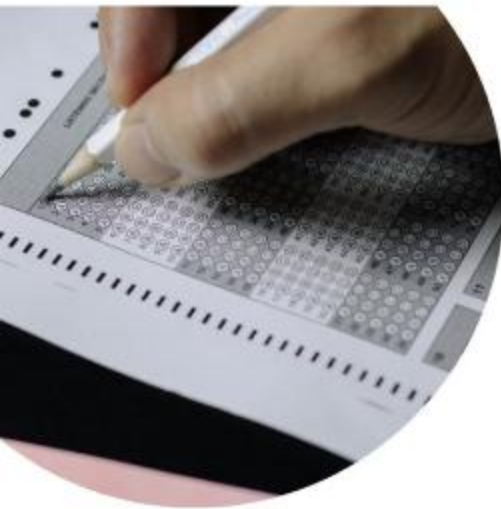
TEACHER ORIENTATION

Assessment is the gathering, recording and analysis of data about the student's progress and achievements. Evaluation is the making of judgements and decisions based on the interpretation of accumulated data. Reporting is the sharing of clear, accurate and timely information with parents/guardians, students and educators

Assessment, evaluation and reporting are used throughout the teaching-learning cycle in order to compile clear, accurate and timely information on student progress and proficiency. They enable teachers to determine how activities and strategies are working and if any changes are required in programming to assist children to achieve the learning expectations for Pre primary.
