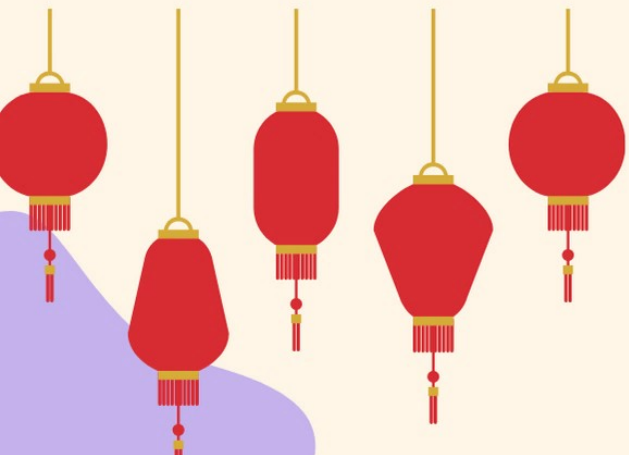

Feast Of St. Chavara.

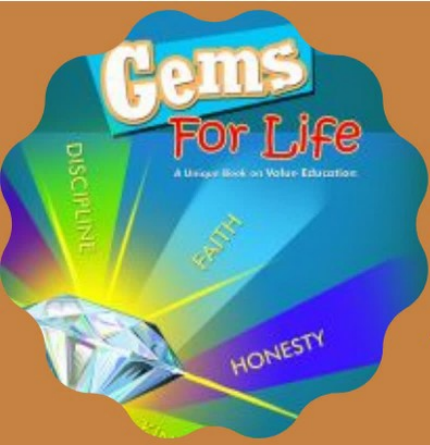


The children who have a love of God and fear of God will love and respect their parents

An online workshop on 'DHEERA' – STOP Violence against Women (VAW) was initiated by Prof. Dr S Shantha Kumari (The Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Societies of India (FOGSI) for teachers and students of Std. IX to X. It was held on January 20th, 2023 at 01:00 PM through Microsoft Team platform.

DHEERA is aimed at addressing causes, risk factors and way forward through a national program for KISA Member schools on aspects related to preventing violence against women and girls and bringing about a shift in the broader societal outlook. Requesting KISA Member Schools to join in this collective effort to build capacities of girls, boys, and teachers to enable them become the leading light and to put an end to this societal issue.

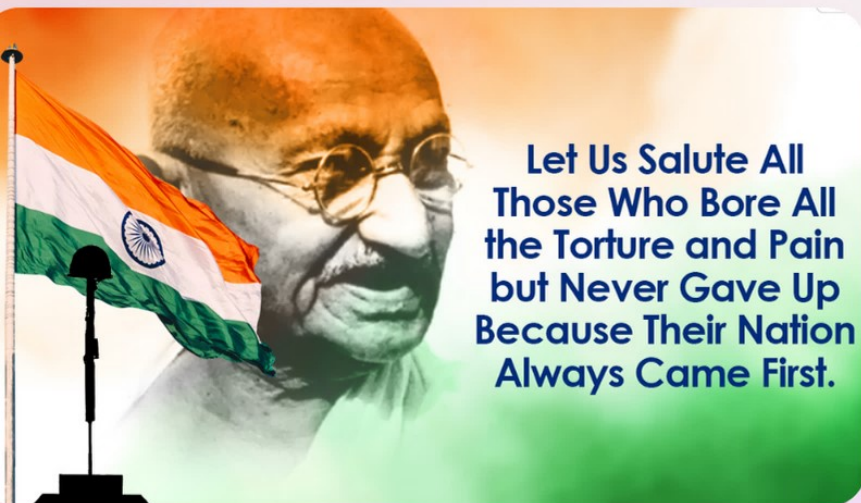
The workshop touched upon the concepts of what VAW is, Roots of VAW, Types of VAW, Management strategies, Bridging Gender and Decoding Peer Pressure by various Resource persons. Students were taught the 'Help Sign' or 'Distress Sign' using their hands. They were brought to an awareness of IPC sections for different crimes such as 326A IPC for acid attack, 354D IPC for Stalking a girl, 354C IPC for Voyeurism, 503 for threats and so on. The whole session was concluded with the words of Malala "I want every girl to know that her voice can change the world."

The programme came to an end with words of gratitude and feedback from students and teachers of many schools. On the whole, it was an eye opening session for students as well as for teachers.

Road Map to Future - Career Guidance Seminar

Career guidance plays a very important role in the lives of all individuals, as it helps in setting future goals and choosing careers. When high school students have a clear understanding of the best career choices for them, the end result is better planning, more college enrollments, and a more productive society for the future. For this, Carmel Convent school organised a Career Guidance seminar for the parents and the students of class X on 21st January, 2023, Saturday.

Ms Shipra was the Resource person of the day. The programme began at 9.15 a.m. Mrs Binu Sebastian, the class teacher of Class X B introduced the Guest and welcomed the gathering. At first, the resource person spoke about careers revolving from one particular career to interdisciplinary or multi skilled careers using powerpoint presentation. Then she guided the students, telling them of the importance of setting up personal goals in life and choosing their career for good reasons rather than choosing for money or scope. This would certainly help them make their vision for their future clearer.

She introduced the students to various streams and careers of Science, Commerce and Humanities as the basics, where one would witness the sea of opportunities in the outer world. She also encouraged them to choose the field they are interested in rather than allowing somebody else to govern it. For that one must follow the Five Steps to choose a career. They are

1. Know Yourself
2. Career List
3. Shortlist and Explore
4. Pick a stream that leads to Career.
5. Iterate - Repetition of a process

Students were also brought to the light regarding various subjects of courses such as Geology, Archeology, Wealth Manager, Healthcare Data Scientist, Imaging Engineer, Medical Device Design Engineer, Biomedical Engineer and many more which are generally not told to the students. This seminar became an interactive and informative session for many parents as well for students. At the end of the session, students were asked to fill the feedback form of the session. Rev.Sr. Catherine, the Principal of the school not only thanked the resource person for guiding the students to have a bright and standard future in life but also encouraged her efforts and knowledge. HAPPY REPUBLIC DAY

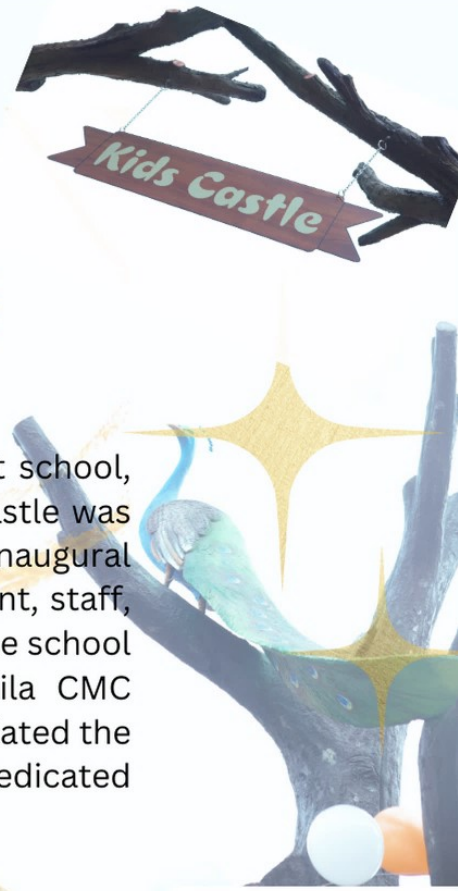
ATULYA BHARAT - 2023
