A teacher should inspire a child to reach academic success. A parent should inspire their child to use that success in a way that influences positive change in the world.






CARMEL DAY








School Bus Driver <u>Appreciation Day!</u>





























Class VI. VII & VIII

In a pitch-black environment, we explored the mysterious behaviour of light and its interaction with objects. This immersive experience allowed us to grasp concepts related to luminescence, phosphorescence, and the way light behaves in the absence of external sources. A lively question-and-answer session followed the workshops and experiments. Students enthusiastically posed questions related to light, which showcased their curiosity and engagement. To encourage participation, Curiouscity Science Centre recognized and rewarded the three best questions with thoughtful gifts, further motivating students to actively participate in scientific discussions. Our field trip to Curiouscity Science Centre was an enlightening and enriching experience. MY VISIT TO CURIOUS CITY feedback

The field trip to Curiosity was a wonderful experience. With much enthusiasm, I participated in this trip, and I actively engaged in the educational and entertaining activities conducted and managed by the Curiosity team. They gave us different coloured bands for each child-red, blue, green, and yellow-and then she took us to the room, where there were four teachers holding colour sheets according to our band colours. I was in the green group, so I sat in the green group. A teacher explained about electricity, which we use in our daily lives. The atom is the smallest part of a chemical element. A proton is one of the three types of particles that form all atoms. Protons have a positive electric charge. Neutron is one of the three types of particles that form all atoms. Neutrons have no electric charge. After that, she showed us a video, then we made a line according to our band colours, then we went to a big hall with several rooms, and the other groups went into different rooms. But for us, a man gave us sheets and a sketch pen when we were in pairs of two. There were posters around us, and we had to look at every poster that had the answers to the questions on the paper. We learned a lot from that, like a shark has special receptors located around the head that detect electrical fields, and then we discussed the answers when everyone had finished. After that, a bell rang, and we went for another session. Sir explained about static electricity, a stationary electric charge typically produced by friction, which causes sparks, crackling, or the attraction of hair and dust. He showed it with some experiments, like rubbing a plastic rod with a cloth and moving the tin can without touching it, making water bend without touching it, and then we saw and touched different things, like making batteries with fruits! If we did not understand what it is and how it works, sir explained it clearly. Again, we switched classes for the next session. There, we learned more about static electricity. One man showed us an experiment with a moving wheel that was attached to two steel bowls, and when you turned the wheel and got the two bowls closer, it would give a spark. Also, we learned that electricity uses magnetic power. In one container, freshwater; in the other container, salt water. There was a small light bulb that was attached to a wall; in freshwater, it did not glow, but in saltwater, it glowed. Then we shifted classes. In this class, there were so many experiments, like there was a fan, and if you were on it, light would come, and there was a switch, and if you were on it, light would come through a lamp, and the fan would turn on because the light was glowing on a black square-like thing that was connected through wires. At last, we went to the theatre room. They showed a video of Earth's magnetism. It was useful for us. This field trip was completely experiential learning for me.

Experiments are learning experiences even when they don't go as planned. Science is the process that takes us from confusion to understanding. Knowledge makes all the difference. A medical expo is an event where medical professionals, healthcare providers, researchers all come together to show case and explore the talent advice in the medical field. Our students of class IX and X visited the MEDEX conducted in St. Johns Medical College by the senior students. It was conducted on September 9th. The topics they highlighted were ANATOMY - Unveiling the intricacies of the human forms, BLS - Equipping with life-saving skits, DISEASE I- Decoding the patterns of disease, FORENSIC I - Unraveling the secrets of legal medicines. . Students were enthusiastically observed and participated in the activities. If was an energetic and knowledge-providing event. Students who participated in the MEDEX understood that health is in wealth. Each student is awarded with a participation certificate also.






















CONSTITUTION **


































































A Heartwarming Christmas Celebration at Asha Bhavan by Carmel Convent School's Social Club
