





Financial literacy workshop









Carmel Convent School Shines at Vista 2024




Dr. Arun Panchapakesan discussed the principles of natural selection and the evolution of humans, providing evidence through ancient artifacts.






NATIONAL DRAWING & HANDWRITING COMPETITION - 2024

Their legacy continues to guide Carmel Convent School to live by the values of faith, service, and love for others.















A Day of Fun & Adventure: Picnic to Jolly Wood


